## Cookie inventory management

Cookies distributed to Girl Scouts and their caregivers must be allocated in eBudde. Watch the video linked below!

## Cookie Cupboards

Cookie Cupboards will *start* to open on Wednesday, Feb. 4, but not all cupboards will be open that day. Days and hours of operation for each cupboard vary due to the type of cupboard and location. Check your eBudde dashboard, click on the map, hover over the cupboard location, and notes for the cupboard will pop up, including days/hours available.

Place all orders to pick up from a cupboard through the Transactions tab in eBudde, 72 hours prior to your intended pick-up time.

## Cookie Booths

All new booths will be uploaded into eBudde only at 6 p.m. daily, through Friday, Feb. 6. This change was implemented on Friday, Jan. 30, to address concerns regarding booths, particularly Walmart locations, being added during daytime hours. All troops currently have a limit of 100 booths.

On Wednesday, Feb. 4, booths will open to an unlimited number per troop. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your SUCM.

## Cookie Finder and Cookie Booths

GSUSA uploads council and MySales booths into Cookie Finder every 24 hours. Cookie Finder is the *only search engine* for customers to find booth locations. Accurate booth listings help people to find Girl Scouts selling cookies. People want to support Girl Scouts and their goals; let's make it easy for them to do so!

Customers can search for cookie booth locations near them by entering their ZIP code in the Find Cookie search bar on the [GSCO Find Cookies page](#).

If you have a council booth that you cannot attend, *please release the booth*. TCMs can join a waitlist for council booth locations and then pick up a booth on a first-come, first-served basis if it is released.

## Add My Sales booth locations to eBudde!

If your troop/Girl Scout has coordinated My Sales booth sites, make sure they have been approved by the service unit cookie manager at least 48 hours prior to the booth.

Ensure that the booth location information, date, and times are accurate, and request to cancel My Sales booths in eBudde too, if your troop/Juliette is unable to work it.

My Sales booths in front of residences and virtual booths *do not* need to be added to eBudde.

## Booth Safety

We've heard from some members and staff this week about concerns for girl safety, immigration enforcement, and Girl Scout Cookie season. Safety is always our No. 1 priority.

For families who may have questions about safety during the Girl Scout Cookie Season, we should reassure them that participation in cookie booths is always optional, and families should choose what feels right for them. If a booth or activity ever feels uncomfortable or unsafe, troops should calmly end participation and leave. There is no expectation to stay or engage further. If there is an immediate safety concern, please contact local law enforcement or call 911.
